Mother Teresa was born in Yugoslavia. She worked very hard for poor people in India. Once she found a young woman who was half eaten by rats and ants. The woman was lying alone. No one was taking care of her. Mother Teresa took her to the hospital. But doctors did not treat her. The mother told this in an interview with a journalist. Mother Teresa opened home for poor and destitute. She also opened schools, orphanages and started skill training programs. She gave a message of care, love and a feeling of being wanted. She was an inspiration to many.

Janaki Iyer is a social worker. She dedicated herself to the teaching and training children from the poorest families who cannot go to schools. Her classes are held in the afternoon. So working mothers' children can attend school. She makes sure of getting good teachers. She takes help from qualified young people to teach different subjects. She also gives vocational trainings. Good values are taught. Many of her students have got admissions in colleges and residential schools.
