

Q.5. (B) Dialogue Writing:

Dialogue is a conversation. In a conversation, every person speaks and listens. It happens on one on one basis. In dialogue writing, 'wh' questions are asked and answered. This process happens in two ways.

Points to remember while solving dialogue writing question:

1. Read the question.
2. What is the topic of the dialogue?
3. Who is speaking to whom?
4. Start the conversation with 'hi, hello, good morning'.
5. Ask questions one by one with 'what, where, who and when'.
6. Answer the questions at least in one word.
7. If you don't know the answer ask the next question.
8. End the conversation with 'bye and see you'.
9. Both the characters should greet each other in the beginning and end of the conversation.
10. Try and complete the dialogue within 8 to 10 sentences.

We recommend students to attempt dialogue writing as it is easy to score marks in this question.

Question sample:

Your friend Aditya / Aditi has passed the examination of Homi Bhabha – Bal Vaidnyanik recently. Write a dialogue between you and your friend about his / her achievement, preparation, the way of his / her studies etc.

Let's write a dialogue for the above question.

Radha – Hi!

Aditi – Hello!

Radha – How are you?

Aditi – Fine.

Radha – Congratulations.

Aditi – Why?

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Radha – You passed Homi Bhabha – Bal Vaidnyanik exam.

Aditi - Thank you.

Radha – When did you study?

Aditi – Last year.

Radha – Where was the exam?

Aditi – In Pune.

Radha – Ok, bye.

Aditi – Bye.
