Lesson 7 Modals - Singular and Plural

English has three persons:

- The first person means the person or group who is speaking "I" or "we".
- The second person means the person being spoken to "you". The second person is always "you."
- The third person is "he," "she," "it," or "they." It can also be a name of a person like "Mr." or "Aliya." It can be "Mohammad" or "Katrina."

Modals are generally in singular or plural and past or present forms.

Rule 1: 'I' is 1st person. 'You' is 2nd person and he, she, it are 3rd person. It can also be a name of a person.

Rule 2: The Verb "To Have" (has, have). The different forms of the verb "to have" are listed below.

	Singular	Plural
1st Person Present Tense Past Tense	l have I had	We have We had
2nd Person Present Tense Past Tense	You have You had	You have You had
3rd Person Present Tense Past Tense	He, She, It has He, She, It had	They have They had

Rule 3: The Verb "To Do" (do, does). The different forms of the verb "to do" are listed below.

	Singular	Plural
1st Person Present Tense Past Tense	l do l did	We do We did
2nd Person Present Tense Past Tense	You do You did	You do You did
3rd Person Present Tense Past Tense	He, She, It does He, She, It did	They do They did
