There are only about 150 prepositions in the English language. These words are very important. Without them, the sentences we speak, read, and write would be difficult to understand. We use prepositions all the time.

- Prepositions tell us time, place and direction.
- Preposition of 'Time' tells us the time of the day, month or year.

We use the preposition 'in'

I will see you in a few minutes.

He works in the morning.

Gandhiji was born in October.

It rains in July.

He is going to be back in second week of May.

When we talk of a specific day, month or a particular day we use 'on'.

I will see you on Sunday.

On 15th August, India became independent.

On the republic day.

On her birthday.



For specific time of the day or short pass of time 'at' is used.

At night, at five o'clock, at lunch time or at sunrise.

Preposition of place: in, at and on.

In school, in India, in the cupboard, in park.

On the ground, on blackboard, on a page.

At home, at office, at the railway station.

Preposition of direction: into, towards, to and through.

He threw the ball to her.

He went towards the station.

I walked to the post office.

The ball went through the window.

Cat walked through the door.
