

Lesson summary:

When the tiger wakes up, he hears teachers and other officials talking outside the room. His master is requesting them to allow him to enter the room. He wants to take the tiger out. But they refuse. They feel that by going inside the master's life is in danger. Finally, after a lot of requests, the magistrate is called. He is also the chairman of the Tiger Committee. He agrees to let the master in on one condition. Master is asked to give an affidavit stating that he would enter the room at his own risk. If anything goes wrong, no one would be blamed.

The master is angry by all this fuss. He purposely writes the affidavit in Sanskrit. He knows that neither the magistrate nor the teachers know Sanskrit. This was his way of making them realize how limited their learning and understanding is. But Sanskrit is an officially recognized language in India.
